


Industrial Demonstrations Program (IDP)

U.S. industry is a backbone of the nation's economy, producing goods critical to everyday life, employing millions of Americans, and providing an economic anchor for thousands of communities. The infrastructure that has powered industry in the United States is outdated and in need of modernization. The Industrial Demonstrations Program will help upgrade facilities in the cement, iron & steel, aluminum, chemicals, and other industrial sectors with first-of-their-kind projects to make them cleaner and better able to compete with newer, modern foreign facilities. These projects will strengthen American manufacturing, improve national security, and spur significant private sector investment in communities across the nation.

Overview:

- The Industrial Demonstrations Program (IDP), with \$6.3 billion in funding awarded to 29 awardees, will accelerate cutting-edge projects in energy-intensive industries and provide American manufacturers with a competitive advantage in the race to lead the world in low carbon manufacturing.
- Foreign companies and countries are investing in these technologies, and the materials they produce are used in everything from our roads, bridges, buildings, and electrical grid to our cars and computers.
- Over 400 projects applied for funding, representing a 10-to-1 oversubscription of funds.
